A letter from Acting Head Pastor Bo Mircea

On this last day of my trip I want to share with you something about the Orthodox Church that I find to be of value in regards to balance. Every church has a place where people go and light candles as means of prayer. As you enter the church courts, there is this little place where you see people going in and taking time to bring their prayers before God. It is a time to reflect on those that have passed, and also to think about those that are still around. Without getting into the theology of afterlife, I find this custom to be a beautiful picture of living in a communal spirit. Who we are today is, in part, thanks to those who came before us, and the ones that keep us going today, who motivate us to be our best. Faith moves us from 'us' as individuals, to 'us' as people. I love to take time to walk to the cathedral in the town square and think about my grandparents, or other people that are not with us anymore, but are in the presence of God. Today that is my prayer for us: Lord, help us to find the balance between the past and the present that will speak to our future. May the Lord help us. Amen.

Through our in-country Matsiko learning centers, every student is given an opportunity to sing in the Matsiko national choir program. Talented students can then audition to sing in Matsiko's national children's touring choir in their own countries or even be a part of a USA bringing orphaned or vulnerable children from all over the world together! Matsiko has performed at the White House under three administrations, the Rose Bowl, Dallas Cowboy Stadium, Disneyland / Disney World, and other NFL, NBA, MLB, & MLS stadiums across the USA! However, the favorite time for the children in Matsiko is when they are at local performances where they can share important bonding time individually that means the world to the children.

World Orphan Choir members are chosen because they have demonstrated the character qualities that we want to see modeled by all of our children. They become ambassadors of hope for the 600 million voiceless and invisible children of the world who deserve an equal opportunity to get an education, develop their talents, and belong to a community where they are valued as human beings. While in the choir they learn unity, important ethics that go beyond ourselves, and racial harmony as they care for one another.

While on tour, they work diligently to complete their school work for their grade, while dramatically improving their English language skills. Every child receives one-on-one tutoring which allows them to advance grades when they return to their own country. They go home as much better students and in appreciation for their experience, they are guaranteed a full ride scholarship through the university or vocational schooling in their country.
